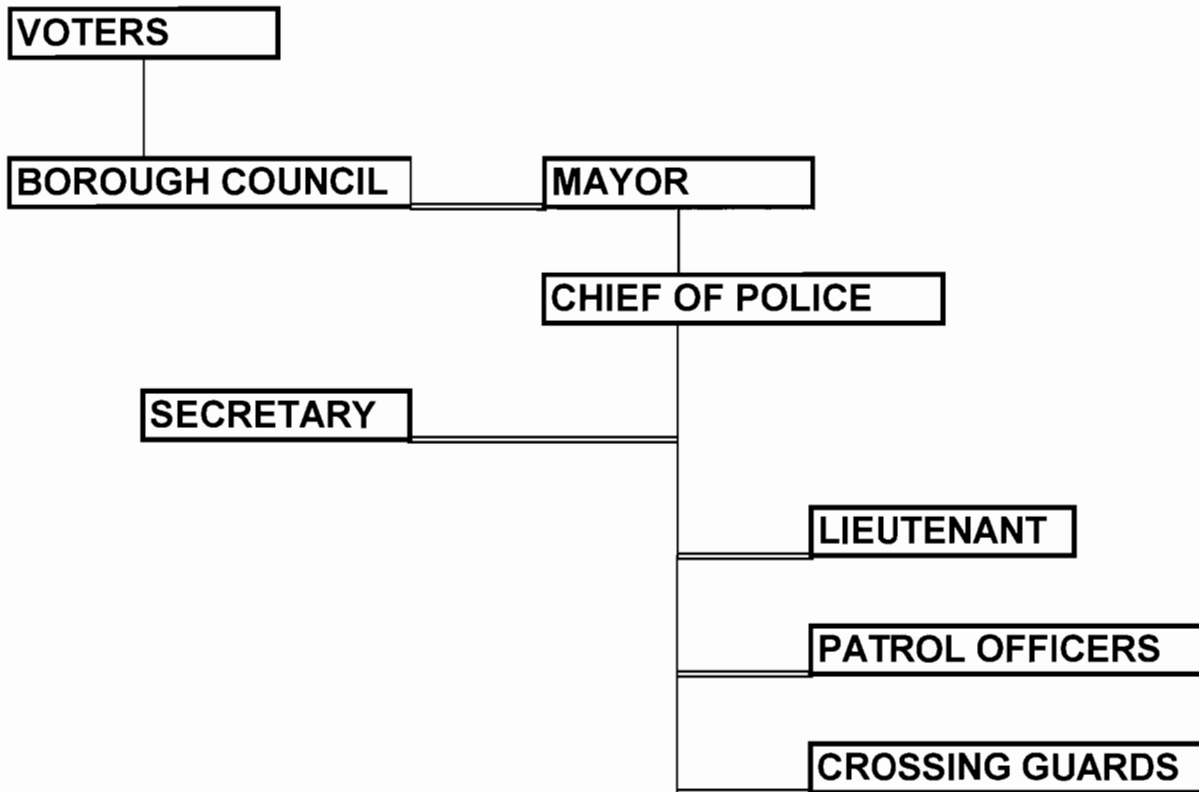

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of providing a better understanding of the following charts representing the activities of the Police Department, the following definitions are provided:

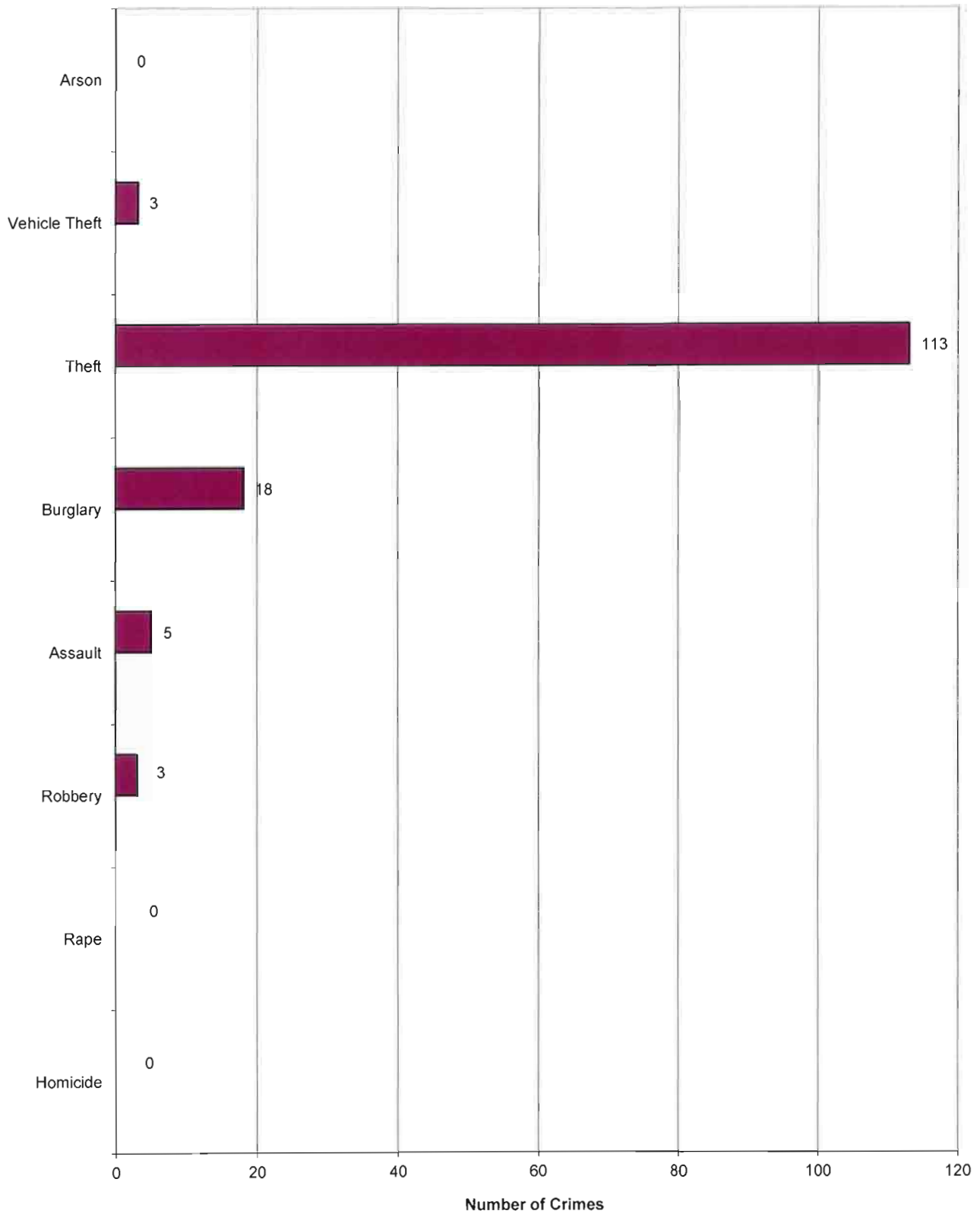
PART I OFFENSES : Criminal Homicide, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Larceny-Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson.

PART II OFFENSES : Other Assaults, Forgery and Counterfeiting, Fraud, Embezzlement, Stolen Property (Buying, Receiving, Possessing), Vandalism, Weapons (Carrying, Possessing, etc.), Prostitution and Commercialized Vice, Sex Offenses, Drug Abuse Violations, Gambling, Offenses Against the Family and Children, Driving Under the Influence, Liquor Laws, Public Drunkenness, Disorderly Conduct, and All Other Criminal Offenses.

POLICE SERVICES : Represents those activities other than crime, which require investigation or Police Assistance. Police services are generally considered to consist of the following: Fire Calls, Service to Another Agency, Public Service (those calls that render a service, i.e. open doors/windows, lockouts, Message Delivery, etc.), False Alarms, Lost -Found Property, Suspicious Persons, Suspicious Vehicles, Domestic Disputes, Neighborhood Disturbances, Animal Complaints, Mental Cases, Suicides and Attempted Suicides, Suspicious Deaths, Traffic related (funeral escorts, parades, etc.), Surveillance, and other investigations of a non-criminal nature.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION : The complete investigation of all motor vehicle accidents which occur within the Borough Limits of Palmyra.

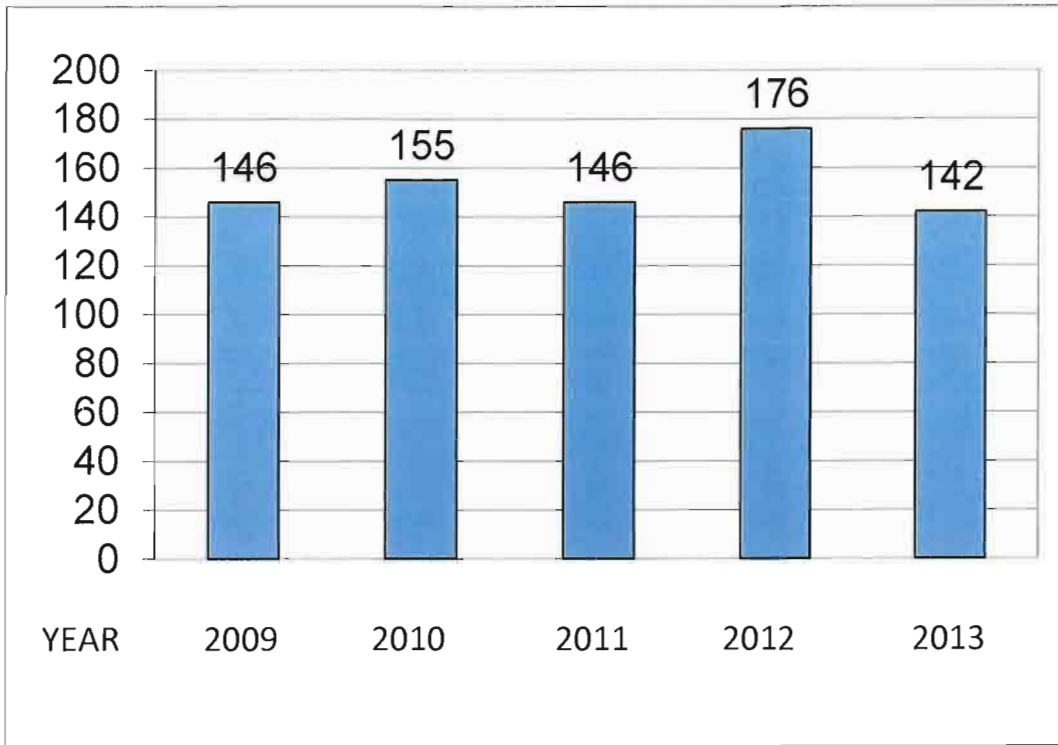

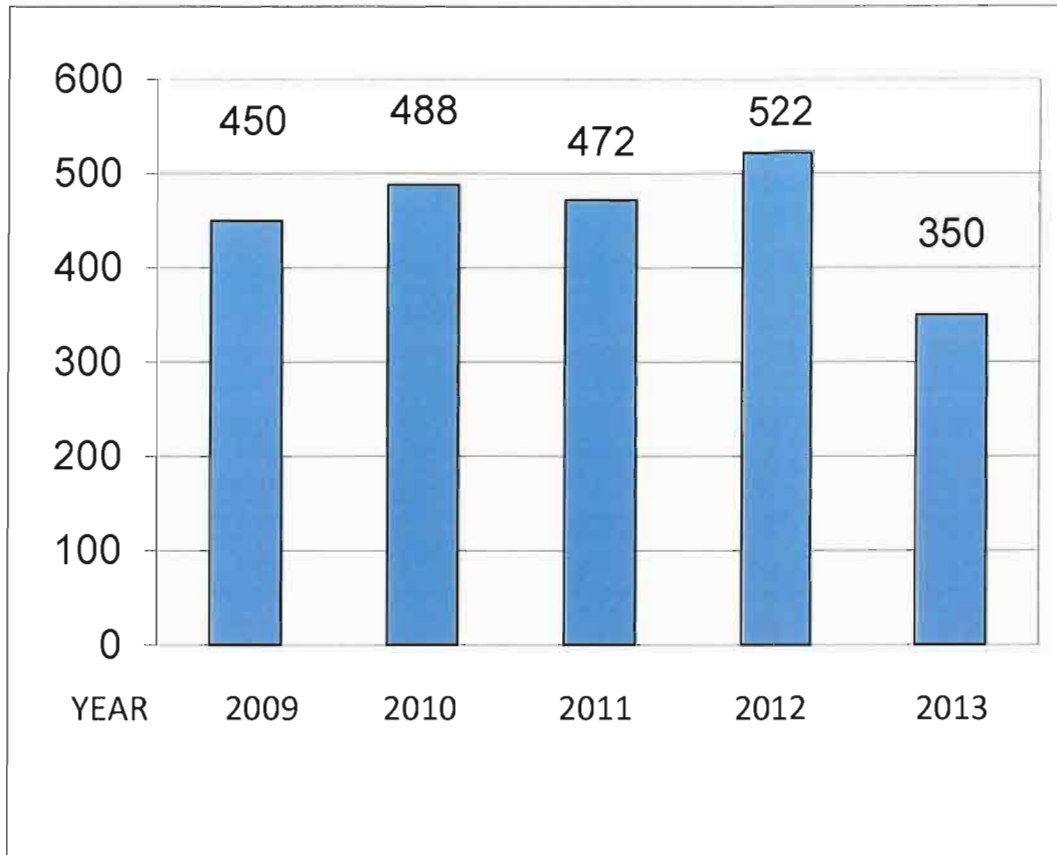
PART I CRIMES (2009 - 2013)



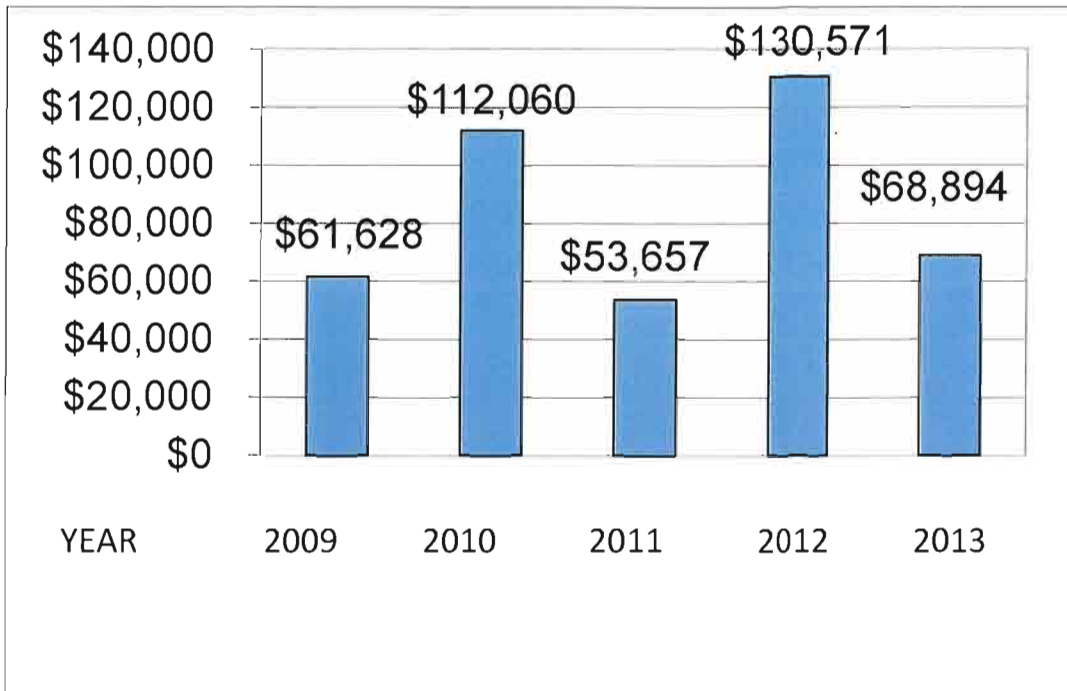
PART II CRIMES (2009 - 2013)



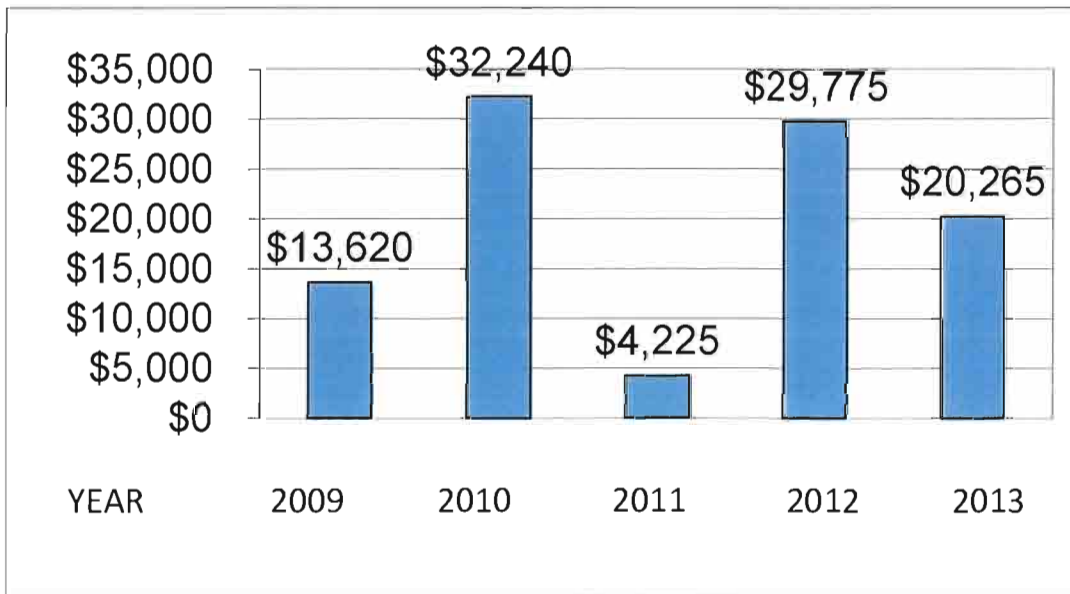
TOTAL CRIMES (2009 - 2013)



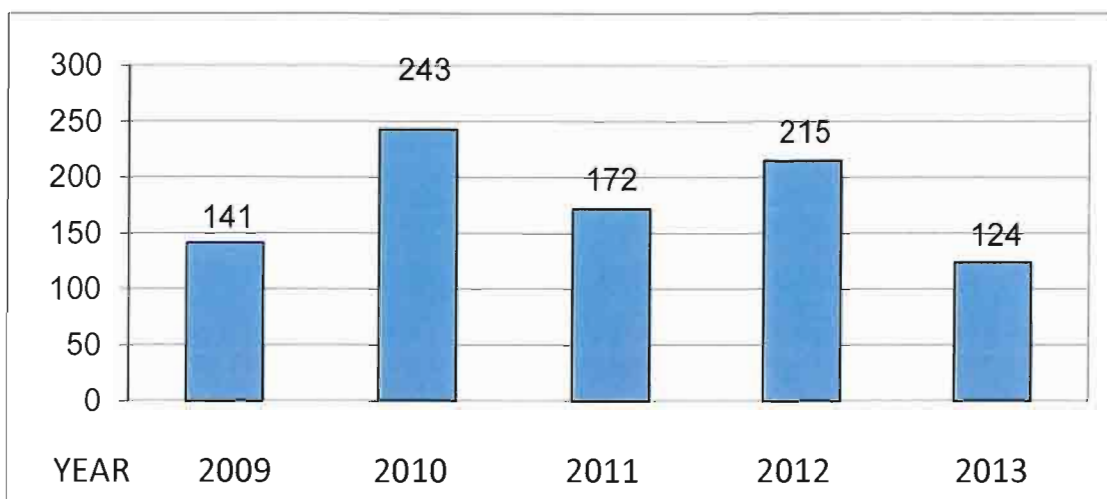
VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN (2009 - 2013)



VALUE OF PROPERTY RECOVERED (2009 - 2013)

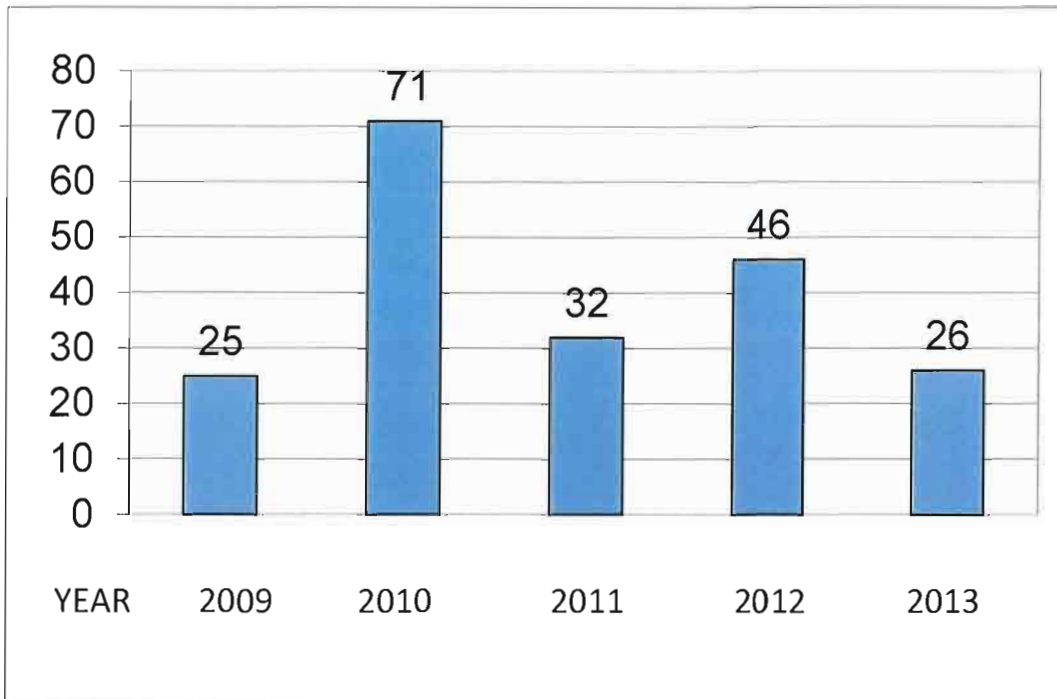

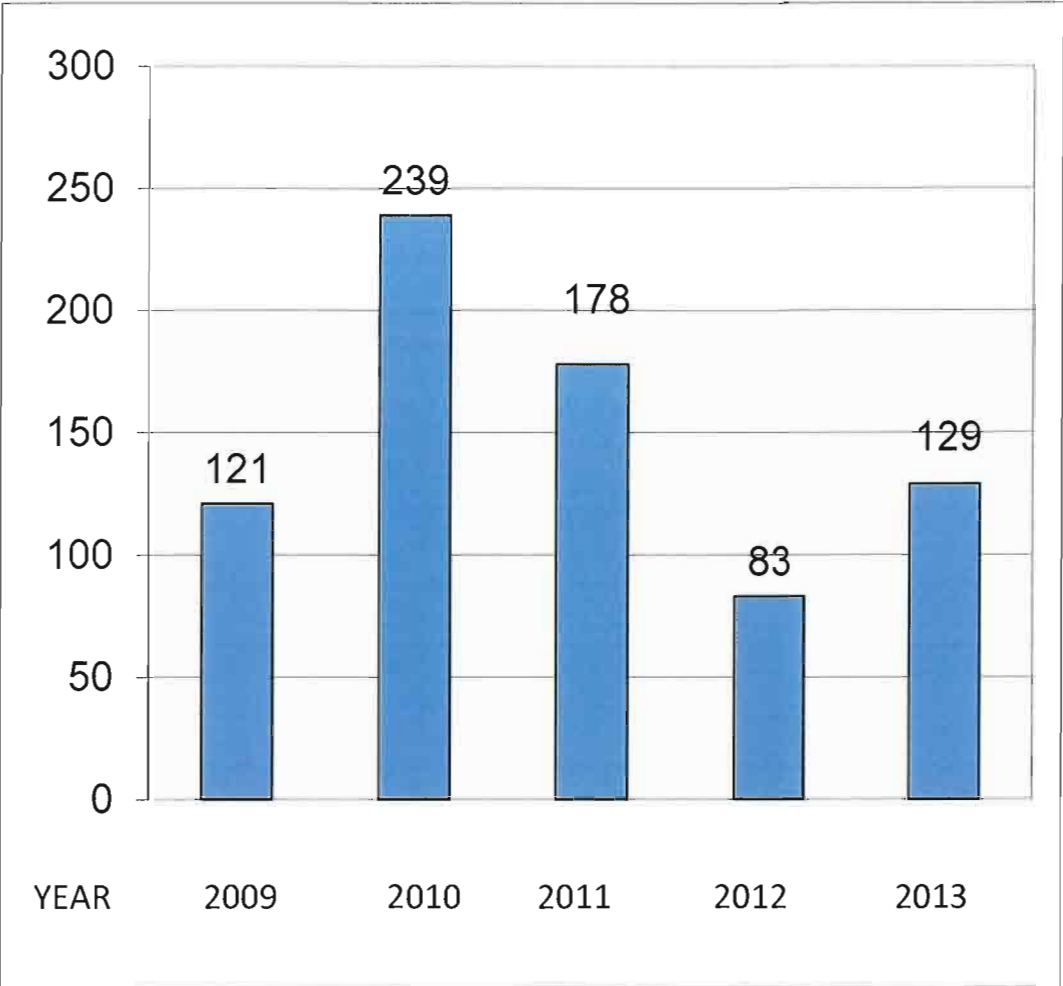

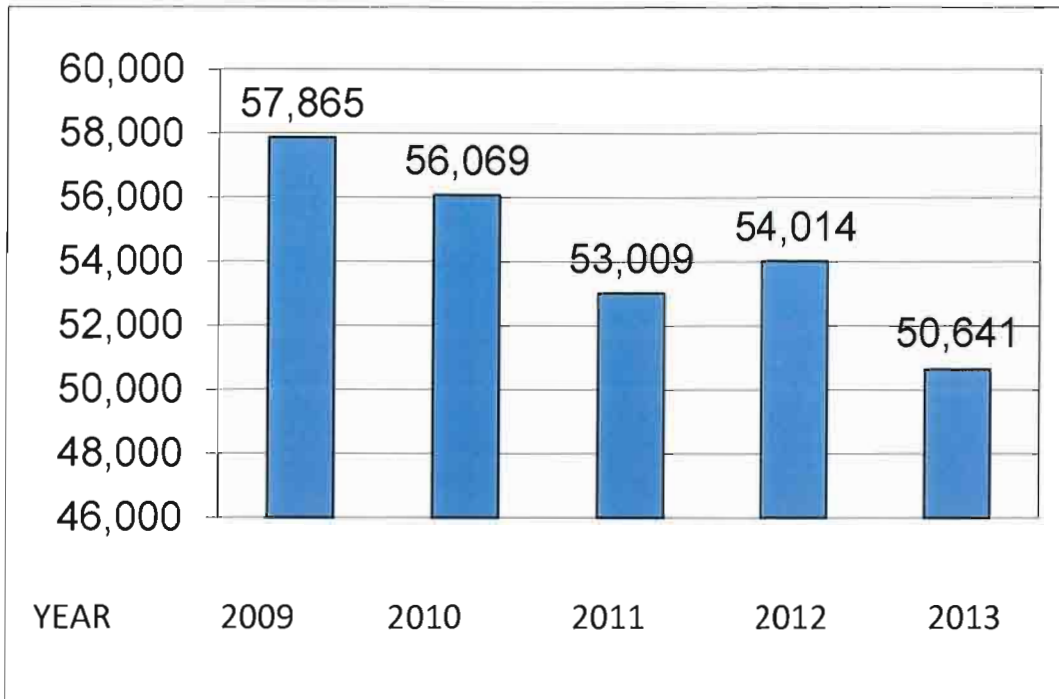

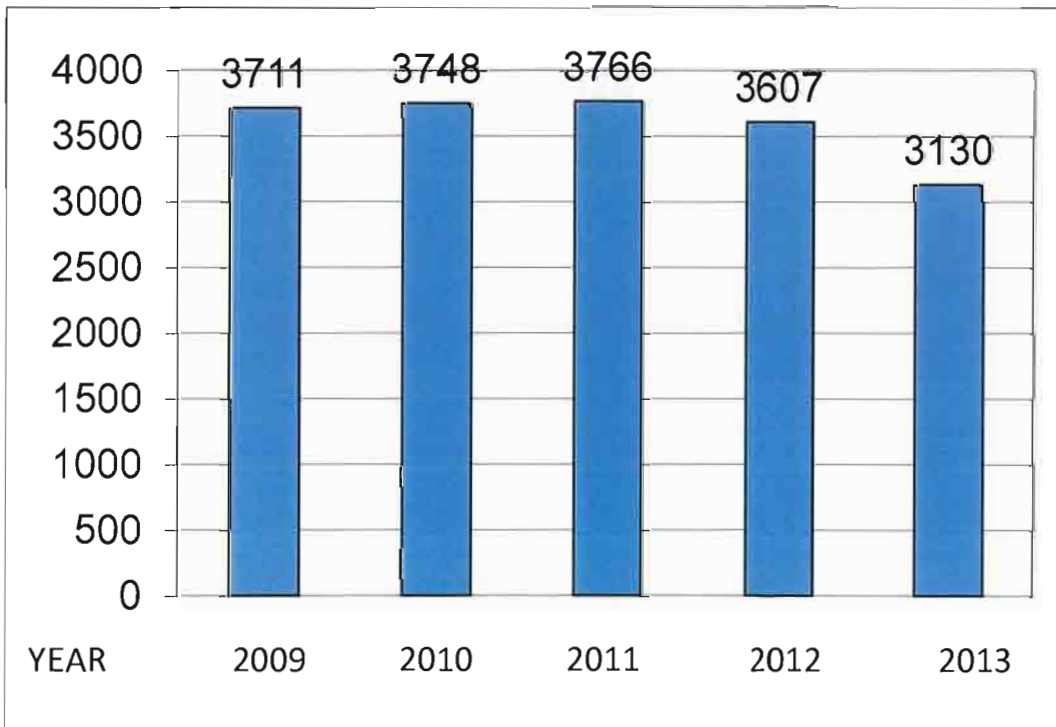
WRITTEN WARNINGS (2009 - 2013)

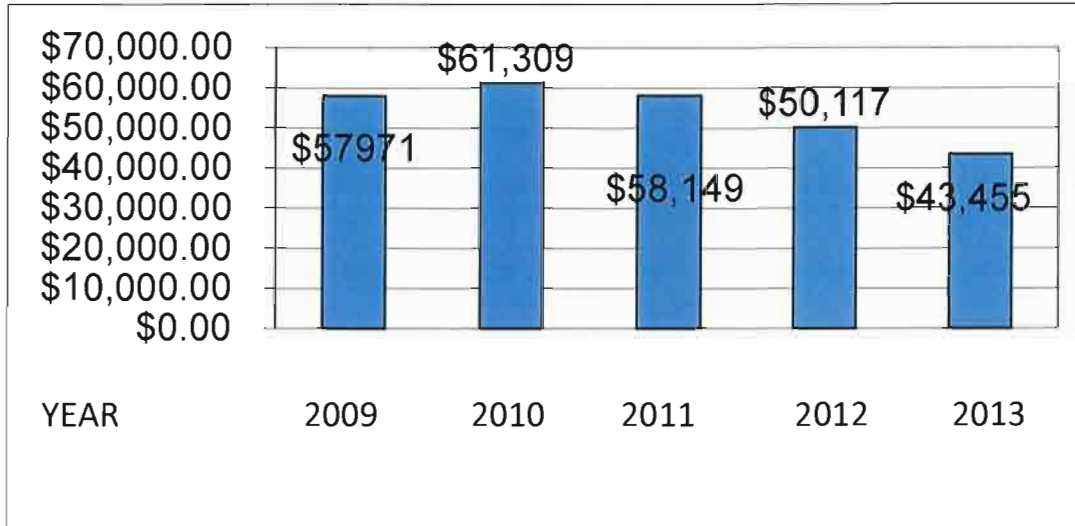

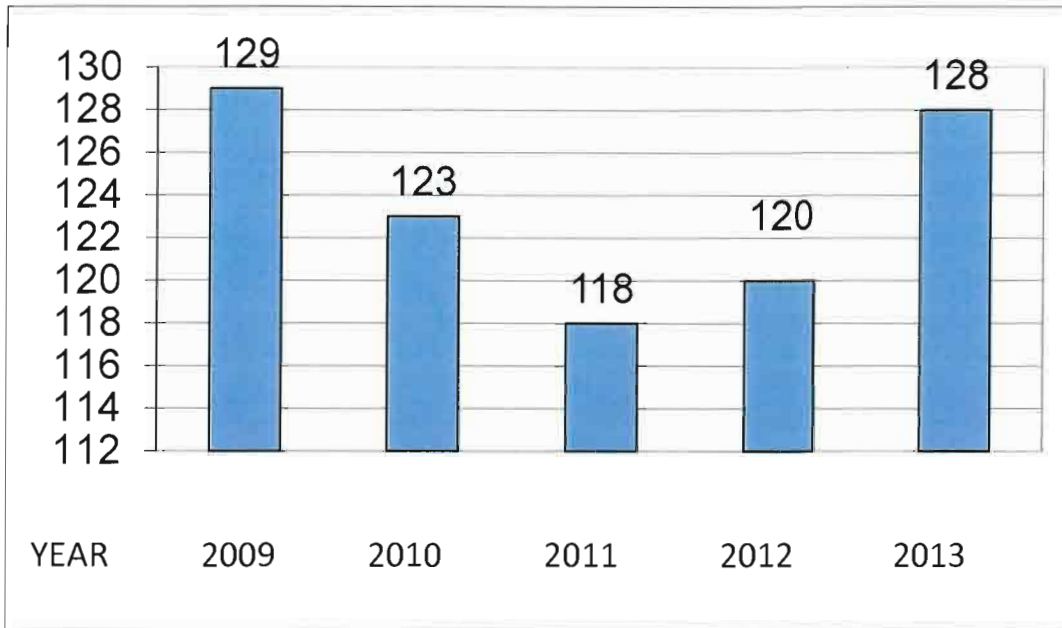

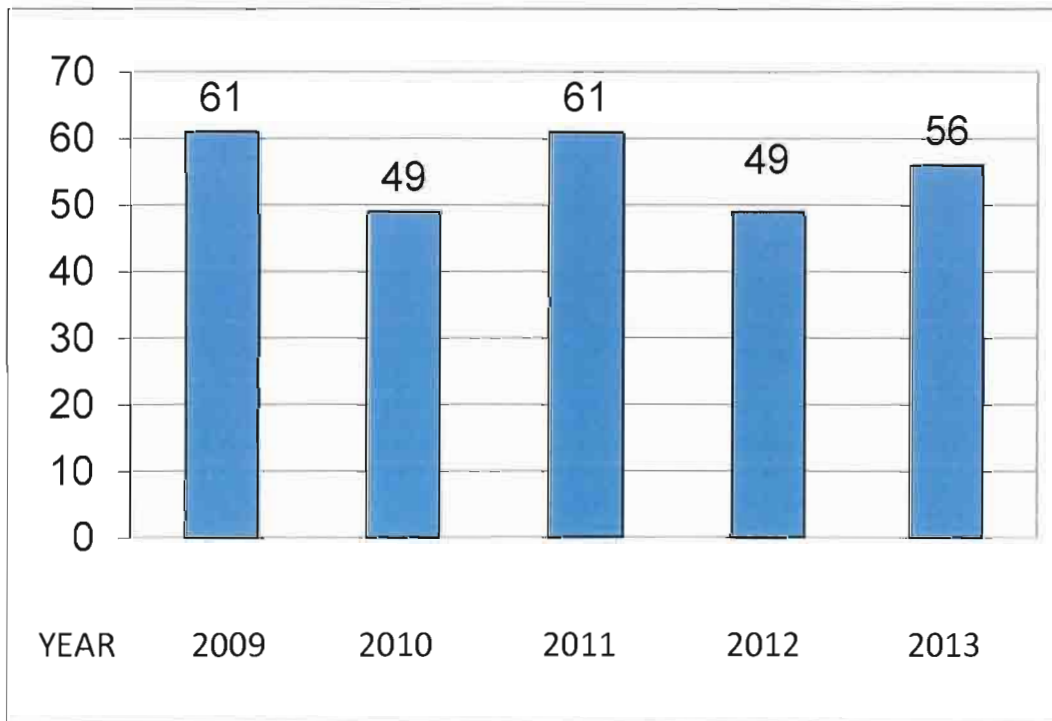

ACCIDENTS INVESTIGATED (2009 - 2013)

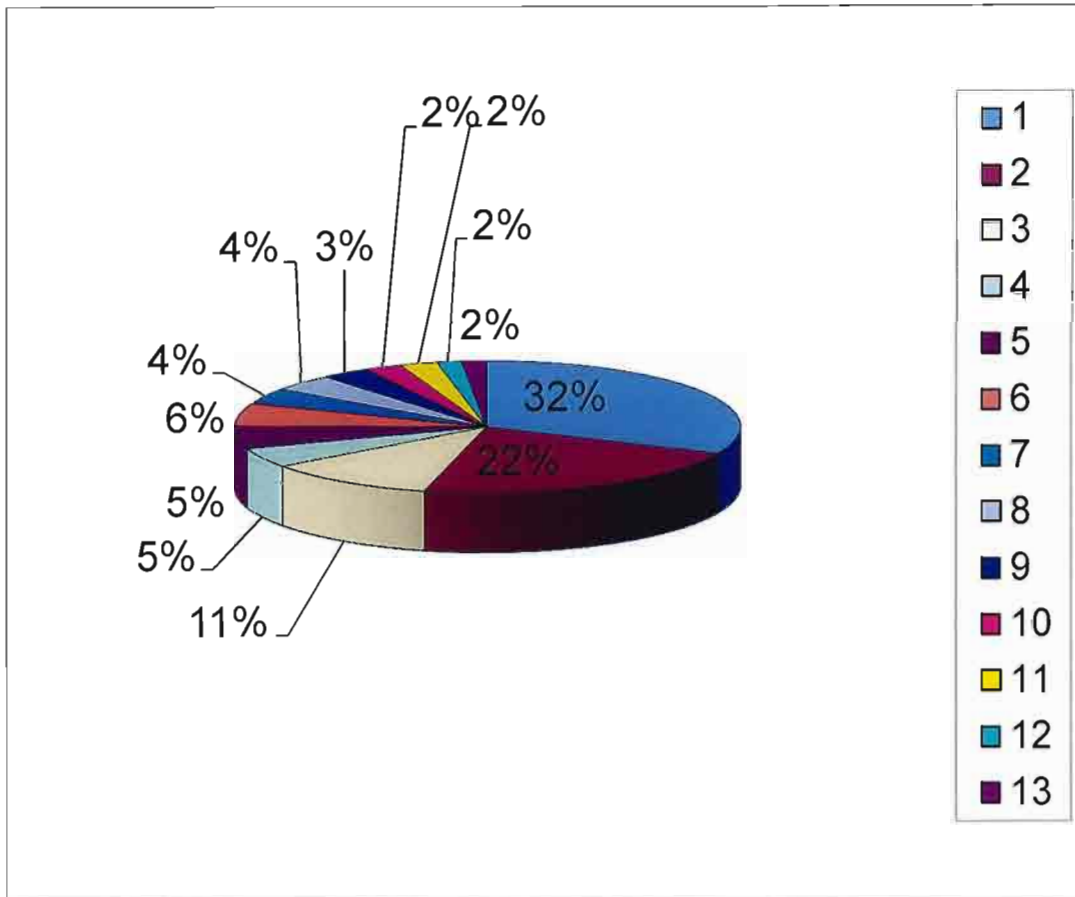


ACCIDENT INJURIES (2009 - 2013)



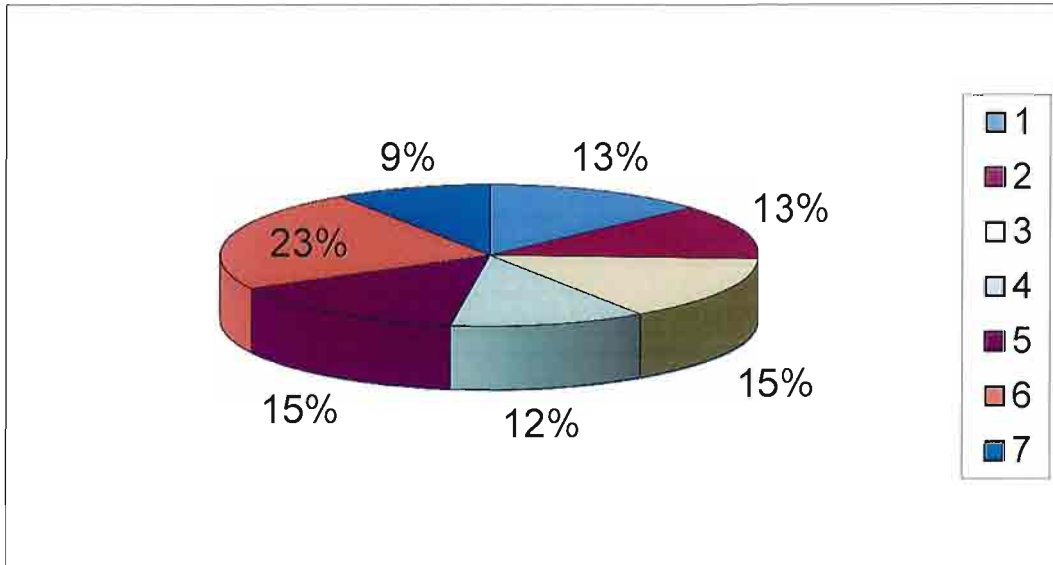

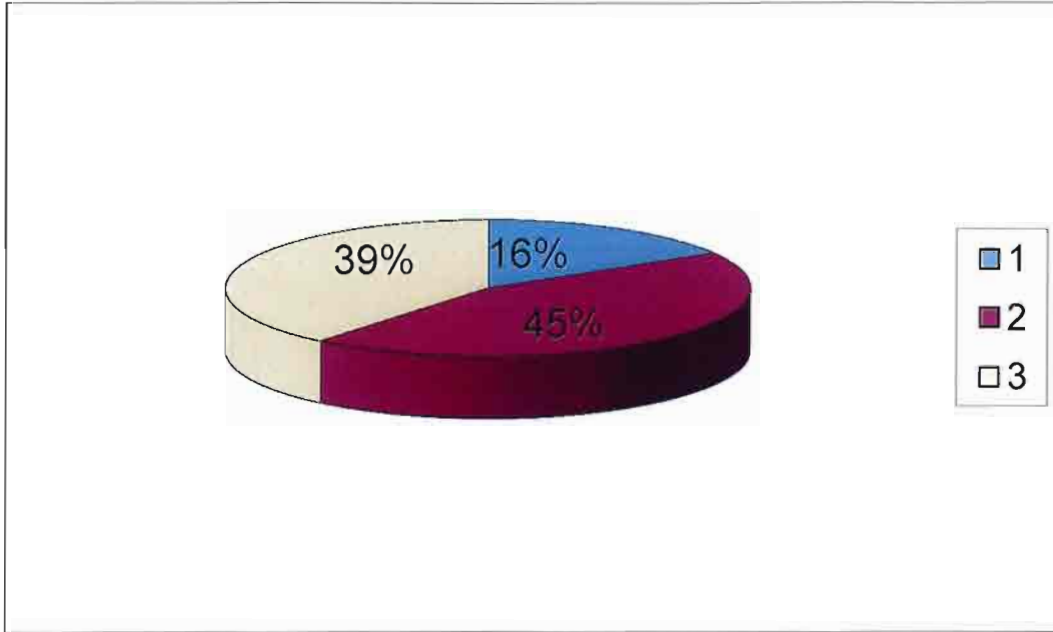

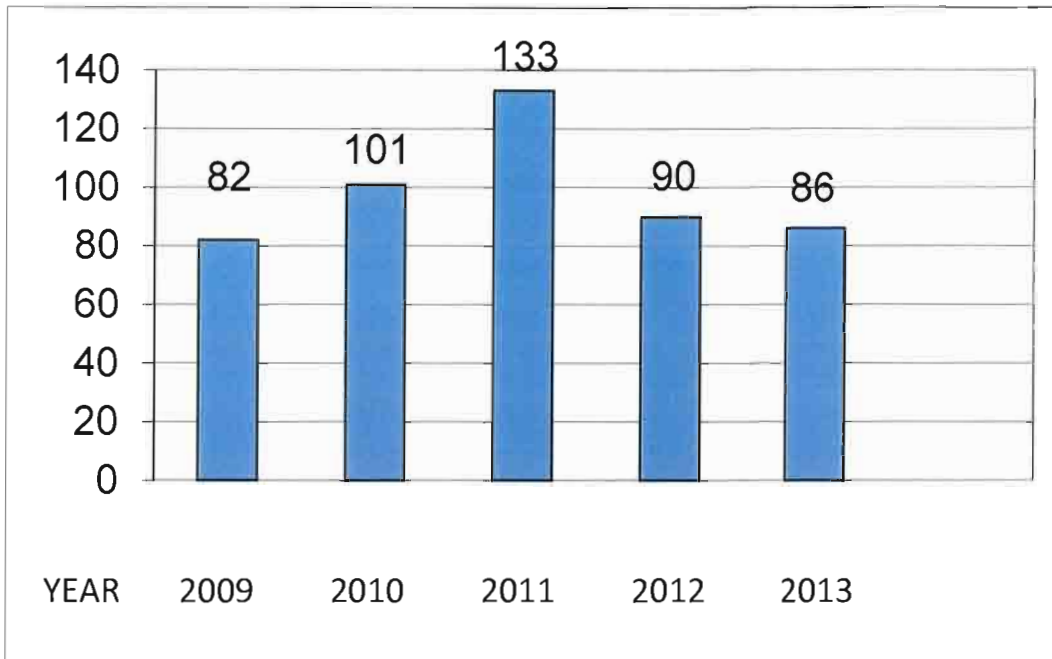
DUI ARRESTS (2009 - 2013)



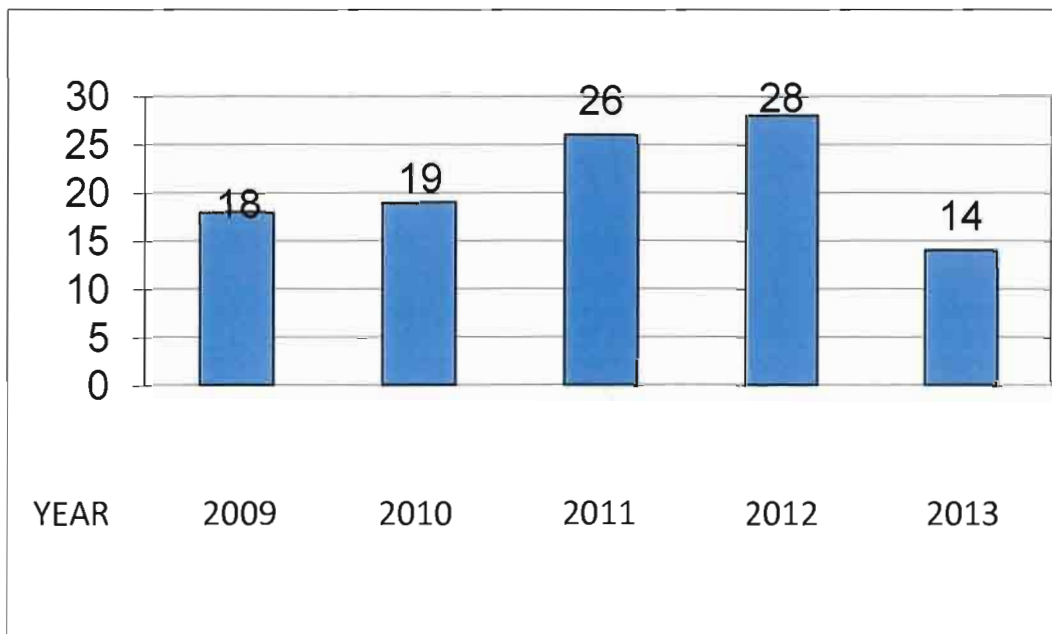
ACCIDENTS CAUSED BY DUI (2009 - 2013)



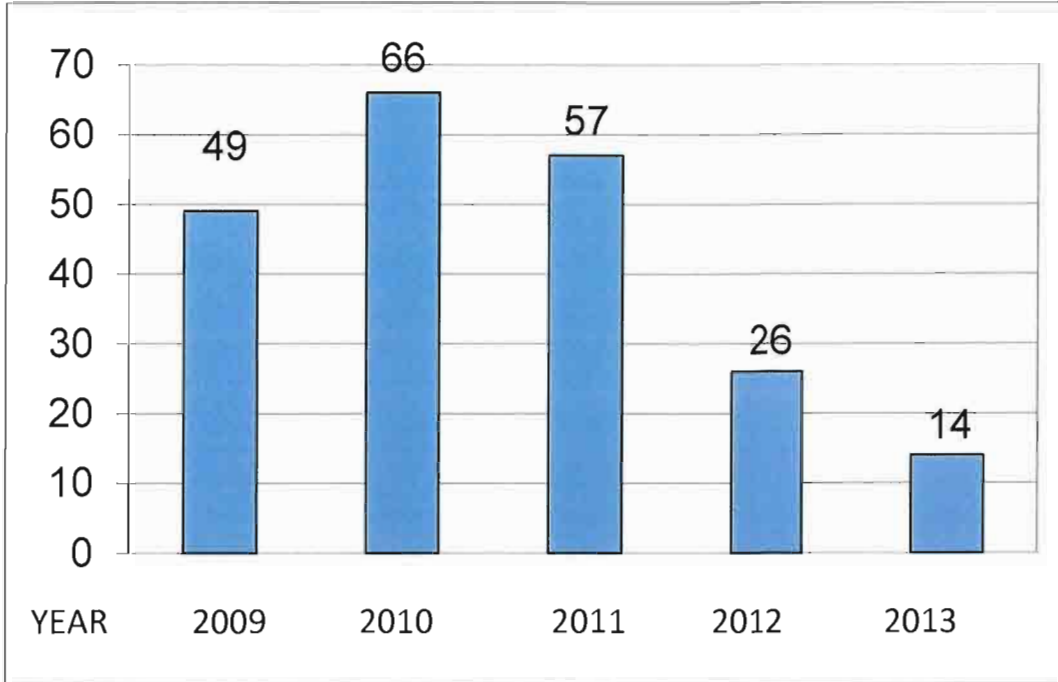
DOMESTIC DISPUTES (2009 - 2013)



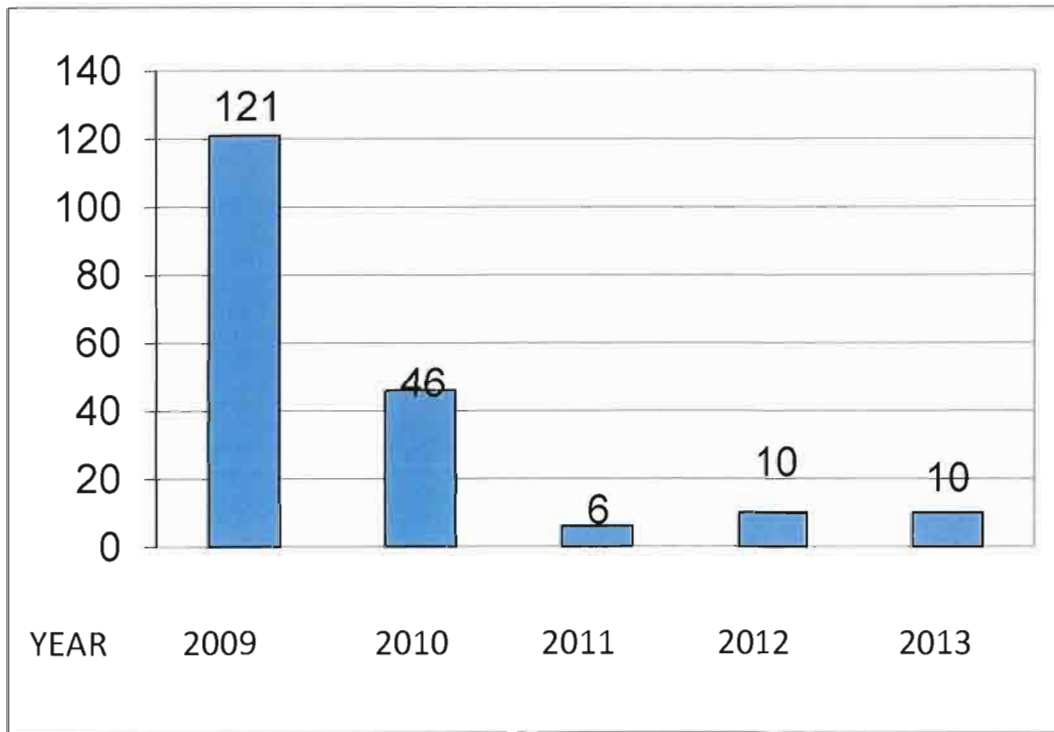

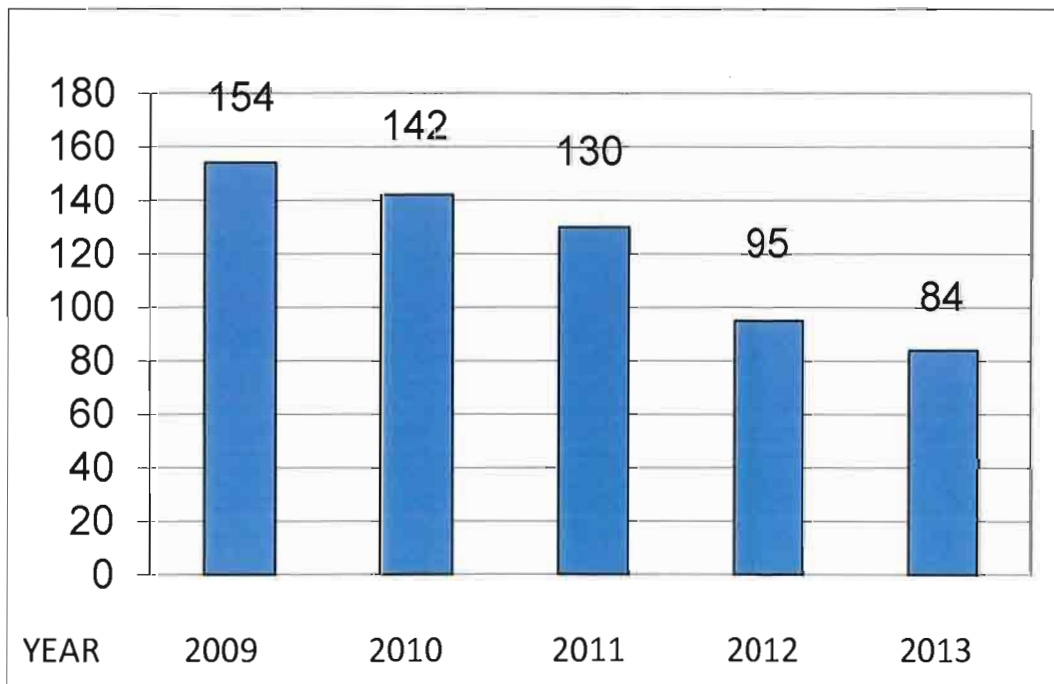

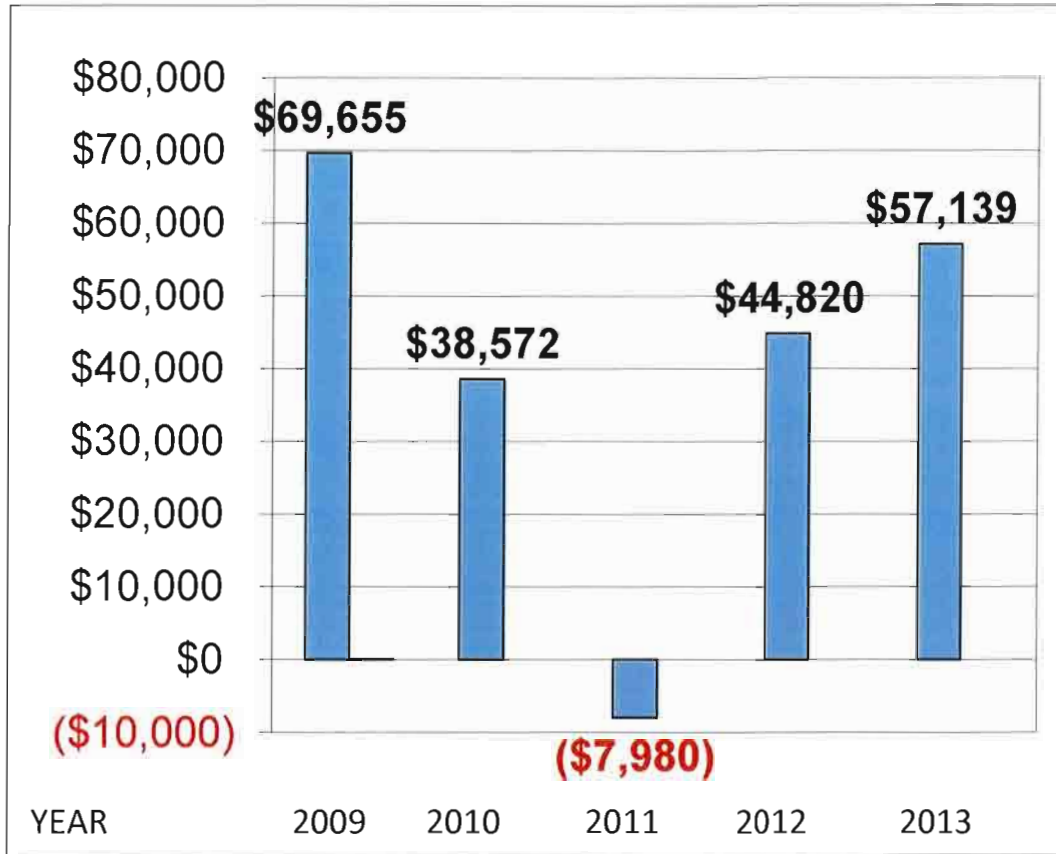
MONIES BUDGETED (2009 - 2013)

ANNUAL REPORT SUMMARY

The Annual Report reflects the various activities of the Police Department for the year of 2013. The report includes police department personnel assignments and duties, as well as a variety of charts and graphs that provide a comparative analysis of the department activities during the past five (5) years.

Our report reflects that Part I crimes in 2013 have decreased 19.77% from the year 2012. Increase was noted in Robbery. Decreases were noted in Arson, Assault, Burglary, Theft and Vehicle Theft in Part I Crimes.

Part II crimes in 2013 have decreased 40.23% over the year 2012. Increases were noted in Fraud and Sex Offenses. Decreases were noted in Other Assaults, Forgery, Receiving Stolen Property, Embezzlement, Criminal Mischief, Weapons Offenses, Drug Abuse, D.U.I., Liquor Laws, Public Drunkenness, Disorderly Conduct and Other Offenses.

The overall crimes for 2013 in the Borough have decreased 33.33% from 2012.

There has been a decrease in 2013 in Criminal Arrests for Adults of 46.20% since the year 2012. Juvenile Allegations for the same time have also decreased by 43.48%.


Non-Traffic citations that were issued in 2013 decreased by 31.55% compared to the year 2012. Traffic citations for the same time decreased by 8.13%.

Total Parking Tickets issued in 2013 increased 3.73% compared to the year 2012. Written warnings increased by 55.42% during 2013.

The number of traffic accidents that were investigated in the borough increased 6.66% since the year 2012. Accident injuries increased 14.28%. Thirty-one and a quarter percent (31.25%) of all accidents reported were Careless Driving, which was the main cause for accidents in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013. Most accidents occurred on Friday and almost forty-five percent(44.53%) of all accidents occurred between 8:00 A.M. and 3:59 P.M.

As in the past, the Palmyra Borough Police Department continues to provide the Borough with the most professional police service possible, maintaining the high standards our community can be proud of.
